- **Committee-** a group of people appointed for a specific function by a larger group and typically consisting of members of that group.

S7. Ans.(a)

Sol. The correct spelling is 'Reigned' (past form of **reign**) which means 'be the best or most important in a particular area or domain.'

Remaining words are spelt correctly and their meanings are as follows:

- **Almighty-** having complete power; omnipotent.
- **Separate-** forming or viewed as a unit apart or by itself.
- **Momentary-** lasting for a very short time; brief.

S8. Ans.(a)

Sol. A slap on the wrist- a mild reprimand or punishment.

Used in a sentence- The fine they gave her is just more or less a slap on the wrist.

- As per the meanings of all the options 'suspended' is the only option that fits perfectly in the blank.

S11. Ans.(d)

Sol. The given sentence is grammatically and contextually correct.

- 'Present participle' can be used to replace as/ since/ though/ because/ if + subject + verb in a sentence.
- Given sentence can also be written as given below without changing the meaning or context of the sentence.

As he knew that he would not be able to buy any food on his journey he took enough supplies with him.

S12. Ans.(b)

Sol. Replace 'The five first chapters' with 'The first five chapters' to make the sentence grammatically and contextually correct.

Adjective of number also known as numeral adjective. It shows how many persons or things are meant or in what order a person or things stands.

Numeral adjectives are categorized into three types.

(i) Definite numeral adjectives - one, sixth, fifth, double, two, fifty-five, second, triple, seven, eleven, seventy fifth, quadruple, fifteen, first, one third, five seventh, twenty, third, ninth, first, etc.

(ii) Indefinite numeral adjectives- some, few, many, all, no, several, any, most, more, too, much, none, too many, certain, etc.

(iii) Distributive numeral adjectives - each, every, neither, either, etc.

The proper sequence is - ordinal + cardinal + multiplicative.

S13. Ans.(d)

Sol. Normalize- bring or return to a normal or standard condition or state.

Disorder- disrupt the systematic functioning or neat arrangement of.

While options (a), (b) & (c) are synonyms of 'Normalize'.

Hence, option (d) is the correct choice.

S14. Ans.(b)

Sol. Agony- extreme physical or mental suffering.

Misery- a state or feeling of great physical or mental distress or discomfort.

Meanings of all other words are as follows:

- **Feedback-** information about reactions to a product, a person's performance of a task, etc. which is used as a basis for improvement.
- **Failure-** lack of success.
- **Feeling-** an emotional state or reaction.

Hence, option (b) is the correct choice.

S15. Ans.(a)

Sol. The word that should be filled in the blank is 'Boosts'.

Boost - help or encourage (something) to increase or improve.

Meanings of other words are as follows:

- **Improve-** make or become better.
- **Rejoice-** feel or show great joy or delight.
- **Reflect-** (of a surface or body) throw back (heat, light, or sound) without absorbing it.

S16. Ans.(d)

Sol. The word that should be filled in the blank is 'About'.

- **About** – on the subject of; concerning.
- **For-** with the object or purpose of.
- **At-** expressing location or arrival in a particular place or position.
- **Beyond-** at or to the further side of.
- For, at, beyond are contextually wrong prepositions since they make no sense with the verb forget in the sentence.

S17. Ans.(a)

Sol. The word that should be filled in the blank is 'Measurable'.

- **Measurable-** able to be measured.
- **Educational-** relating to the provision of education.
- **Immediate-** occurring or done at once; instant.
- **Quicker-** moving fast or doing something in a short time.
- As per the meaning of all the options 'measurable' is the most appropriate option to fill in the blank.

S18. Ans.(c)

Sol. The word that should be filled in the blank is 'Achievement'.

- **Achievement-** a thing done successfully with effort, skill, or courage.

- Sentence Q follows sentence S because it explains the perks of achieving success.
- So, the proper sequence is – PSQR.

S23. Ans.(b)

Sol. Reading all four sentences we can conclude that sentence R is the most appropriate option to start the paragraph.

- Sentence S comes after sentence R because it elaborates context of the paragraph 'happiness' and the day dedicated to it.
- Sentence P follows sentence S because it adds on to the context and builds up to sentence Q.
- So, the proper sequence is – RSPQ.

S24. Ans.(d)

Sol. The given sentence is of 'Active voice'.

- The sentence is said to be in active voice when 'Subject' is active & does something.
- Now we have to convert it into passive voice.

- Passive voice – If the sentence is in passive form, the subject remains inactive. It does nothing, but allows something to be done.
- In the passive form, the object of the verb in Active voice becomes the subject of the verb in the Passive voice. 'By' is introduced as now the subject receives the action by the object.
- Structure in active voice- Subject + will+ have +v3+ object.
- Structure in passive voice - Object+ will+ have+ been +V3+ by + subject.
- The sentence thus formed is - The gift will have been brought by his friends.

S25. Ans.(c)

Sol. The correct answer is option c.

- The given sentence is 'Direct Speech'.
- Direct Speech - Reporting the message of the speaker in the exact words as spoken by him.
- The given sentence is an 'Assertive Sentence.'
- Sentences that make a statement are called assertive sentences. These sentences may be positive, negative, false, or true statements.
- While changing it into an indirect form, we consider following rules.
- The given sentence is in present perfect continuous tense.
- 'Here' changes to 'There'.
- Reported Verb- 'Said to' changes to 'Told.'
- Conjunction- In the Assertive sentence conjunction 'That' is used.
- Tense- Present Perfect Continuous changes to Past Perfect Continuous tense.
- The sentence thus formed is - Radha told Mamta that she had been waiting there for a long time.
